Our Engaged Ministry Team’s Mission of the Month for April is the Alpha Omega House on Brown Street in Iron Mountain. The house is zoned for eight residents and was opened in 2013 as an extension of the jail ministry.

During their stay, the men are offered assistance in finding employment, housing, transportation, substance abuse, and mental health services.

Alpha Omega House is a community outreach under Catholic Social Services of the Upper Peninsula. Donations fund most of the home’s budget, and the center is run almost exclusively by volunteers.

The mission of Alpha Omega House is to provide a safe housing environment based on mutual dignity and respect, promote well-being, and encourage positive social contribution through faith. The facility serves our community by providing a sober living environment for men transitioning from addiction to sobriety. Please give to our April Mission of the Month.

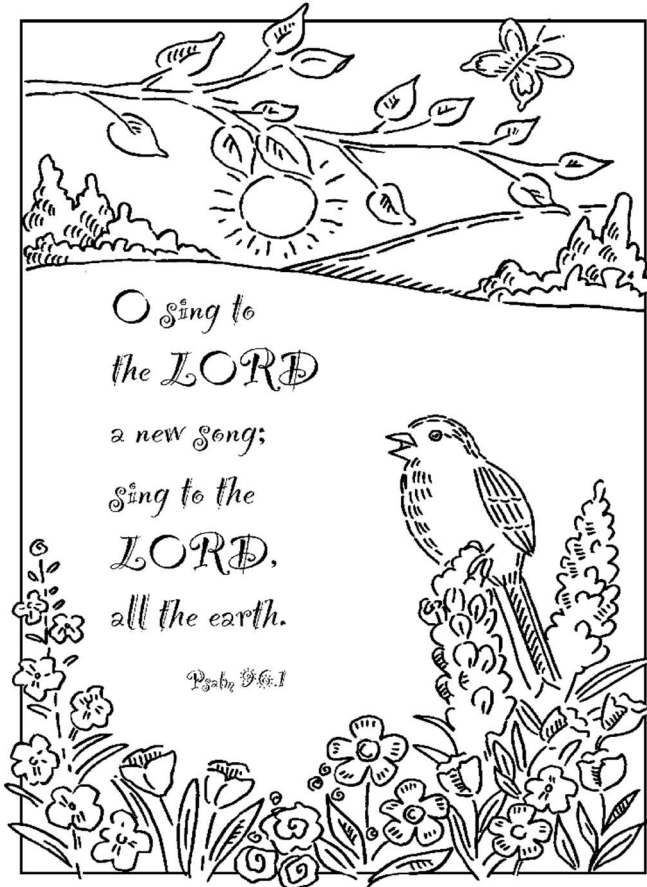

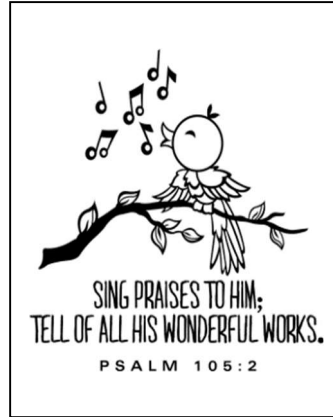

We would like to think that perhaps early September is a time when we could resume Sunday School, youth activities, and the nursery. The following Dickinson County information is being used to assist with the decision-making: Infection rate, death rate, vaccination saturation, and the actions of public schools and restaurants.

Church Council has assigned a sub-group with representatives from Finance, Trustees, and Staff Parish to help with recommendations for 'Next Steps.'
