Pastor's Ponderings

I am amazed, how about you? Amazed at the way life can change so quickly. First the schools shut down. Then the churches canceled worship. Then the restaurants (except for carry out). Now, just today (Monday) the Governor has made an Executive Order to suspend all activities that are not necessary to sustain or protect life. Wow...that's a lot to grasp.

What do you think? Is keeping the church office open, answering the phone and keeping people connected necessary to sustain life? Is the Community Meal necessary to sustain life? I am making a clear statement: YES! To both of those things—as long as there are people willing to use their time and energy in that way. Sally, our church secretary, is willing to continue working in the office and the Community Meal teams are each being asked to do what is right and best for them. Some will continue and some may not...that is a choice that we can respect, whichever way it goes. (See what we are doing with the Community meal on p. 3)

Sure, we are all spinning from all the cancellations and government orders. Bishop Bard weighed in on March 13 (see p. 3) and we will probably hear from him again this afternoon. The most critical committees at church are meeting right now over the phone and by e-mail. However, we are...NOT meeting for worship. NOT gathering for previously scheduled events and meetings.

This is the new normal until such a time as the weensy, weensy, teeny, tiny COVID Virus 19 is tamed, destroyed, vaccinated, cured, wiped out, or whatever we can figure out do with it so that we can get on with what we really want to do!

I'm just sitting here wondering, how is God changing us, in the midst of this new normal? Remember that God uses every situation in our lives as an opportunity for growth, for hope, for good. We can't be close to each other right now, but we can find ways to connect more faithfully to the Holy One, the one who created us and loves us!

As hard as it is to live with the uncertainty, the changes, yes, even with the fear, I encourage you to take time to relax and be with God. You can use the Spiritual practices on page 4 of the Tower. There are a couple of them for you.

If you are able to help someone with a special need, call the office and we'll find someone who needs your assistance. Both of these are great ways in which to draw closer to God as we stay connected with each other.

If you are tired of the new normal and want to look ahead, see page 6 where there is a box with Church Unique ideas spelled out in a condensed form. See what you think about a possible future for us as the Unique and special group of people that God has put here at the corner of Carpenter and E St.

Trinity UMC has a rich past and this new normal is just another stepping-stone into a future designed by God to be a blessing for us and for our community. God will use EVERYTHING in order that God's dreams can come true on earth as in heaven.

As you look at the calendar on p. 9, think of it in terms of '**Wishful Thinking/Hopeful Planning.**' There is no way to know at this point when we will be able to gather together again, so please: **Call the church office before coming to the building, 906/774-2545.** And keep talking to each other and to God who loves hearing from you. Bishop's Message on Coronavirus (note the date) March 13, 2020, 4:00 p.m., by Bishop David Bard

Dear Friends in Christ, what a difference a few days or even a few hours make in the midst of a crisis.

Last Saturday, we gathered as an Annual Conference at Albion College, to take significant action for our denomination; today such an in-person gathering would not be permitted, as our Governor has banned all gatherings of 250 people or more throughout the state, due to the Coronavirus and COVID-19.

Just yesterday, I sent a pastoral letter encouraging good hygiene and appropriate social distancing as you make decisions about worship and church events.

Given developments of the last few hours, I need to ask more of you as Michigan United Methodists. I am asking that each United Methodist church in Michigan refrain from in-person gatherings for the remainder of the month of March. This would include worship, Bible studies, and any other meetings.

We are at a critical juncture in stemming the reach of coronavirus and as a church, we can play an important role in slowing the spread of the COVID-19 disease.

I am not asking that you close the church, only asking that together we find new ways to be the church. Use electronic media to share in worship and Bible study. Hold the necessary meetings electronically. Care for one another with phone calls or other social media connections. Give to your church electronically or by mail.

Our conference website will continue to provide good information to you about ways we can be the church in this unprecedented time. Please look at it often. To find good information about the spread of the virus and about hygiene and social distancing, please continue to go to the webpage coronavirus.gov.

This is a time like none other we have experienced. I take this disease seriously, and I want the church to do its part for the health and well-being of our world.

I also take seriously our shared faith in Jesus Christ. This Jesus, who encouraged us to be wise as serpents and innocent as doves. This Jesus, who often said, "Do not be afraid." This Jesus, who encouraged us to let the anxiety of each day be enough. This Jesus whose resurrection we will soon celebrate.

It is my deepest prayer that when Easter comes around, we will be able to gather joyously, face to face, for worship. I would invite you to join me in that prayer. Thank you.

The Monday meal at First Presbyterian Church in Kingsford will be served via a drive-through process only, until further notice. Please follow the

instructions given by a First Presbyterian Church volunteer. Cars will flow through a designated lane. NO ENTRY to the church will be permitted.

- Time: 5:00 – 5:30
- Do not exit your vehicles
- They will hand the meals to you.
- God's blessings to EVERYONE during this time.

The Wednesday Community Meal at Trinity UMC:

We are serving meals on a week-to-week basis. On March 18, there were almost 100 meals served by the team. Half went to the Alpha Omega house, and there were 35 to 40 people who picked up for their families and friends. The March 25 team is making plans for spaghetti as usual, and the April 1 team is sounding positive about their ability to provide. Please check the church's Facebook page for confirmation of the meal before making the drive in—just in case plans change. can no longer be paid by the church at age 65 through the Conference. The increase in salary is less of a financial burden to the church, than what was paid to the conference. The SPRC will contact the Finance Committee with final proposal and brought to the Council for a vote. The consensus around the table is all are in favor of making sure that Sally's take home pay is not affected by adding the cost of health insurance to it.

Pastor passed out copies of the **Spiritual Gifts Inventory**. Members of the Council are encouraged to fill it out and turn it in. Responses will show the strengths and weaknesses of the Council. Then the chair-people and group leaders can have their committee members fill one out. This is a great tool in recognizing our strengths and engaging people in conversation.

SPRC project *Deepen the connections among the people of Trinity UMC in order to share the love of God with each other*, was scheduled for Sunday, March 22. During the current crisis, we are encouraged to reach out to each other to see if there are needs that need to be met, or report back to Sally or Pastor if you met the need of someone.

Outreach

Engaged Ministry Team - Bruce reported the team wants to donate \$500 to help support the needs of the people who may be financially affected by the Coronavirus. The \$500 will be given to the Brothers Keeper Fund for helping people in need of supplies, food, and necessities.

Community Meal Program - Wednesday meals will be served to people in the community by takeout only. Starting at 5 p.m., meals can be picked up in the parking lot. Meals will be available until 6 p.m. or until gone. Other teams will observe and decide if the meal takeout will continue in the following weeks.

Worship - Trinity is in the process of making our presence electronically through social media type ministry. Dean, Jerry, and Pastor are working to get a live worship experience for people to view on Sundays. Worship to include a short sermon, prayer, and announcements.

Witness

Due to the Coronavirus and COVID-19, Trinity will follow the guidance from the Governor and Bishop Bard to suspend face-to-face worship services and group gatherings at the church. Committees will meet only for critical decisions that CANNOT be made through e-mail and phone calls. The 12-step programs will continue to meet as usual. Larry Marlett has been contacted to focus on daily cleaning after each meeting room is used and entrances.

Minutes of the Church Council Meeting, March 16, 2020

Roll Call: Jerry Harwell, Blair Daugherty, Dean Laitinen, Pastor Geri, Jack Noyce, Frank Trumbell, Renee Grunewald, Bruce Clark, and Lea Varda.

Pastor Geri has been keeping in touch with the congregation and the United Methodist Conference through emails and social media as Trinity powers through the challenges due to the Coronavirus. She read the words from Isaiah 41:10, *So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.* Pastor closed devotions with a prayer.

The February minutes were reviewed. Discussion to put an article in the Tower to clarify tax information on Mandatory Minimum Distribution was left out of February minutes. Minutes were accepted as amended. Agenda was set by the Council members.

Nurture

Staff Parish Relations Committee - Dean updates the Council members on the SPRC progress to increase the secretary's salary to support her transition to pay for her supplemental health insurance. Her health care premium

Resources and Leadership Development

Treasurer's Report - Jack reports the February giving was low and operating expenses were normal for February. There was the need to advance \$3,800 from the Marie Bleecker Fund to cover February expenses. The Designated Funds are looking ok. The meals program is getting low in funds.

Finance Report - A \$270 memorial in memory of Hank London was given. A leaf for the memorial tree was purchased and the remaining \$70 is to be used wherever needed.

Bruce motioned the remaining \$70 of the memorial gift be moved to the designated meals program.

Blair seconded. Motion passed.

Trinity received a check for \$2,400 from Dickinson County Hospital System for the use of the parking lot for 2019-2020. **Bruce motioned to put the \$2,400 from DCHS into the General Fund. Blair seconded. Motion passed.**

Finance will track the impact on the church finances with the Covid-19 crisis. The goal is to have information available on a week-to-week basis about the income and expenses coming in. It may be useful to look ahead in case this is a long-range situation. Finance will compose a letter to the congregation which will go out as soon as possible, including the Direct Deposit form and the Easter flower form.

Trustees - Blair and John Erickson are working together to provide Larry Marlett with guidance of the routine and additional cleaning/disinfecting process throughout the church building. Sally and Pastor will keep Larry posted on which rooms need daily attention. Also providing necessary supplies to complete the tasks.

Trustees are seeking bids for carpet replacement. Estimates will be for replacing carpet in sections.

Pastor's Time

Pastor Geri handed out final copies of the 2020 budget to members who wanted them.

A discussion of current 2020 attendance compared to 2019 worship the average attendance is down. For the first 10 weeks, worship averaged 87 in 2019 and 74 in 2020. The averages included both services and the Evergreen service.

The Tower is being prepared, so articles need to be submitted as soon as possible.

Pastor closed with a prayer.

Minutes of the Church Council Meeting, February 24, 2020

Roll Call: Blair Daugherty, Patty Ronan, Dean Laitinen, Jack Noyce, Frank Trumbell, Jerry Harwell, Kristy Ryan, Pastor Geri, Emma Bilgreen, Ruth Carlson, and Lea Varda.

Devotions began with introduction of Council members and the committees they serve on. The Council welcomed Emma Bilgreen, a youth representative to the Council. Pastor Geri ended with an inspiring prayer.

The January minutes were reviewed and accepted as amended. The word "Draft" was removed. Minutes were final. The February agenda was set by the Council members.

Nurture

Pastor Parish Relations Committee – Dean updates the Council members on the SPRC progress of putting together a package including all the decisions made for the staff insurance policies to present to the committees.

Outreach

Engaged Ministry Team – Patty shared the schedule for the "Mission of the Month" is set for the year. The Ministry team will use the old name tag cabinet to set up a display to keep the congregation informed on current activities. They will be working to get the Habitat for Humanity projects up and running.

Resource and Leadership Development

Treasurer's Report – Jack reports the January offerings and income were greater than January expenses leaving a positive balance of \$448.84. Both District and Conference Ministry Shares are paid up to date. All Designated Funds doing well. A new Designated Fund for Vacation Bible School will be added. Trinity UMC did not meet the requirements to pay sales tax in 2019.

Finance – Frank made a motion to set aside \$500 of Bleecker Funds to purchase a new TV and TV cart for the second level of the church building. Patty seconded. Motioned passed.

Trustees—Blair talked about the money received for the use of our parking lot. Trustees are looking at upgrading the electrical panels in the Sanctuary, which could be \$6,000 or more. New carpeting bids are being put together to see how much that would cost—even to do it in stages. Different lighting around the building will be considered when the weather gets better.



Spiritual Growth Gifts Inventory Assessment – The Spiritual Gifts Inventory is a multiple question form completed by 22 people in the church. The survey was initiated from the Church Unique Workshops. Council members are encouraged to complete the gifts inventory. They are the leaders of the congregation, and it's good for leaders to reflect on their skills and abilities. Then the chair people and group leaders can take the assessment to their committees to encourage committee members to fill one out. Pastor shared some of the information gathered from completed surveys and listed the top strengths in each area. This can be a great tool in recognizing our strengths and engaging people in conversation.

Pastor's Time – Worship attendance has been low over the past couple of months. Average attendance is 80 people. She will check to see how that compares with previous years.

One challenge is some people do not have a way to attend worship. This can be due to no vehicle or the ability to no longer be able to drive. Could this be a new ministry opportunity? Something to think and pray about.

Invitations were made by letters to and conversations with 11 families for youth Confirmation. Classes are for students in 7th-9th grade. Only three students have expressed interest.

The UMW Lydia Circle has been actively inviting others to gather in Christian fellowship at Hulst Manor in Iron Mountain. This is a great example of how Trinity can reach beyond our walls to offer the love of God to those around us. Compliments to these UMW ladies for their commitment to share the word of Jesus with others.

The Conference has a new brochure for the Church Unique Workshops. The Conference has also put together a list of leadership questions. Pastor read through some of them. Council members engaged in much conversation in an effort to assess the willingness of people at Trinity to participate in discussions around Mission, Values, Strategy and Measures. It was generally agreed that these types of conversations are not a waste of time. The next session of Church Unique at Trinity is February 28-29 with Naomi Garcia.

Pastor closed with a prayer.

Pastor Geri reported that the American Legion Auxiliary wants to use the Fellowship Hall on June 13. The Trustees approve of this.


The hospital paid \$2,400 for the use of our parking lot for two years. The Trustees recommend that this money should go into the general fund.
