I would like to start by asking that those who may use Zoom and other computer tech within their jobs consider coming on board...and I would like to ask that anyone reading this who we see in the overflow room during services (hello, young folks) let us know that you can be an “operator” on occasional Sundays. This is a HUGE service that you would be providing to those who cannot get to church but would like to worship, and is truly a tech ministry. The training time would be minimal, and it’s a pretty straight forward process to learn.
